Mrs. Margaret Daniels Akers, 74, highly esteemed resident of Sipes Mill, this county and wife of E. Norman Akers passed quietly to her eternal reward at the Fulton county medical center on February 7, 1951, where she had been admitted as a patient a few days hence suffering with a paralytic stroke. Mrs. Akers had been in declining health for a number of years but remained active in affairs until stricken a short time before her death.

A daughter of the late Hon. James and Emaline Daniels, she was born in Licking Creek township on October 18, 1877. She was united in marriage to E. Norman Akers on May 2, 1912 at Hagerstown, Md. The love and devotion in all church and civic affairs served a distinct purpose in her good christian life. She taught in the public schools of the county for more than fifteen years. She was singly honored a few years ago for having been a 50 year teacher in the Sunday schools of the Sideling Hill Christian Sunday school. She enjoyed the conversations and viewpoint of hundreds of friends wherever she went. She was postmistress for a number of years of the Sipes Mill office until her retirement and discontinuance of that office two years ago. Mr. and Mrs. Akers operated a general

merchandise store for many years at Sipes Mill.
