

Robert G. Alexander

Death has claimed one of the best known and beloved natives of Fulton county. Robert Gibson Alexander, 66, a life long resident of Fulton county, died at his home in McConnellsburg on December 28, 1955, after a lingering illness of two and one-half years.

He was born of the late James Grere and Hannah Washabaugh Alexander and was born in Ayr township on August 11, 1889. He was united in marriage to Laura Henry on April 7, 1914. To this union was born one son James Franklin.

Mr. Alexander had taught school within the county for four years, after which he became an employee of the Fulton County Bank for 39 years. In this occupation he became widely known and respected throughout the county. His advice and assistance to many, who sought his better judgment, proved valuable in many business dealings.

He has been a life long member of the Reformed church. He was also a member of George Washington Lodge No. 143 F. and A. M., George Washington Royal Arch Chapter No. 176, Jaffa Shrine and I. O. O. F.

Survivors include his widow, his son, one brother Scott, and one grandson, all of McConnellsburg.
