WELLS VALLEY MAN DIED OF HEART ATTACK

John Elmer Anderson, a resident of Wells Valley, dropped dead January 16, 1946 while at his work at the Harbison-Walker Refractories, Mount Union. There was no person with him at the time he was stricken, but his lifeless body was found at 10:45 A. M., shortly after he passed away. A physician in Mount Union pronounced that he had died of a heart attack. He ran a stone crusher at the brick plant and had reported for work at 7:00 A. M.

He was born in Huntingdon county on December 8, 1879, the son of Abram and Emma Rotz Anderson.

On June 10, 1901, at Hagerstown, Md., he was united in marriage to Orval Lockard who survives with the following sons and daughters:
