

Barmont

Henry Barmont a highly respected retired farmer died of carcinoma of the stomach, at his home in McConnellsburg, Penna., December 22, 1927, at 3:35 P. M.

He had been in failing health since last March, but was able to be up and about until about five weeks ago.

He was born in Ayr township, September 18, 1850, of French Huguenots descent, being the youngest child of John and Margaret James Barmont, who emmigrated to United States from Germany, ninety-eight years ago.

February 15, 1881, he was united in marriage to Mary Louise Roettger and they followed the occupation of farming, spending most of their life on their farm north of McConnellsburg.

He was of a very quiet disposition, honest and industrious and a member of the Reformed church.

Surviving are his widow, and the following children: John D. of Williamson, Penna.; Nellie M., a local nurse; Harvey L. of Saint Thomas, Penna; W. Rush and C. Earl on the home farm, and Rheue C., at home; also one brother, Daniel of Harvard Nebraska and seven grand children.

Funeral services were held from his late home, December 26th, at 1 P. M., conducted by his pastor, Rev. William J. Lowe, assisted by Rev. H. L. Jarrett, with interment in Union cemetery.
