

JOSEPH C. BARNETT

The many friends of Joseph C. Barnett were saddened when it became known that he had passed away on Monday night, March 18, 1940 at 7:40 o'clock. Although he had been in failing health for 5 years and had been in a serious condition for the past 6 months, death came as a shock.

He was converted in early manhood and his faith in his Savior never wavered. He attended Mt. Tabor church as long as his health permitted and was the teacher of the Bible class for the past 8 years. The community has lost a good citizen, the church has lost a faithful worker and the home has lost a kind husband and father. The influence of his life was a blessing and a help to the ones around him. Although he suffered immensely, he bore his suffering patiently.

Rev. Thomas Bambling preached a very fitting and appropriate sermon from the words of Paul—Timothy, Chap IV, 7th verse, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept this faith."

Joseph Clarence Barnett was a son of the late Jonathan and Harriet (Foote) Barnett, and was born near Waterfall on February 22, 1880, hence was aged 60 years and 25 days at the time of his death. Mr. Barnett was twice married, his first wife being Margaret Leona Cutchall. They were married on April 14, 1903. She died on September 13, 1910. To this union a daughter and a son survive, Mrs. Belola M. King of Gracey and Mr. Clarence E. Barnett of Hustontown, Pa.

His second wife was Ida M. Shaw. They were married April 25, 1912. The widow and two daughters survive: Misses Ruth J. A. and Althea L. Barnett, both at home. Five brothers and two sisters also survive: Howard Barnett of Waterfall, Bert Bar-
