Arthur Barnhart died at the home of his parents, Isaac and Ida Barnhart, in Bethel township, near the Maryland Line, on December 2nd, 1915, aged 19 years, 5 months and 14 days.

In addition to his parents he is survived by one brother and two sisters who live in Maryland.

His remains were laid to rest in the Presbyterian cometery at Warfornsburg on the Saturday following, Dr. J. S. Webster, of Hancock, conducted the funeral service.

One night about the first of October, two young men, Harry and Walter Barnhart, both full cousins, called Arthur from his home and lured him a considerable distance from the house where they beat and cut him almost beyond recognition. From loss of blood and exposure, it was thought that he would live but a few days, but his youth and vitality prolonged his life two months. It is alleged his death resulted from stab wounds.

The fight occurred on the edge of the McCusker-Roman feud zone, and if our authorities make no effort to punish the guilty ones, the southern part of Bethel township, no doubt, will soon become notorious for these affairs.
