

Crystal Spring Woman Dies From Severe Burns

Mrs. Louise M. Barton of Crystal Spring, died on October 4, 1962 from burns, which she had suffered the previous Sunday. Mrs. Barton had been heating paraffine, when the melted wax spilled over her setting her clothing on fire.

She managed to put out the fire and get her flaming garments off just as members of her family came to her rescue. She was taken to the Chambersburg hospital, where it was found that she had suffered extensive burns of the hands and the right side of the body.

She was born on October 24, 1898, in Fulton county, a daughter of the late John and Nellie (Mumma) Davis and was united in marriage with James M. Barton, who died on Jan. 16, 1961.

Surviving are three daughters, Winifred E., Hilda M., and Virginia Barton, at home.

The deceased was a member of the Gapsville Christian church and belonged to the Cleo Rebekah Lodge of Breezewood.

Funeral service was held on Sunday afternoon at the Conner funeral home with Rev. Coy Foor officiating. Interment was in the Gapsville Methodist cemetery.
