The subject of this sketch was born in Belmont county, Ohio, November 28, 1830, and died October 11, 1900, at the residence of Andrew Barney, in Fulton county, of a complication of

diseases, aged 69 years, 10 months and 13 days.

Mrs. Beatty lived in her native state until she had grown to young womanhood. In 1852 Miss Mann, for that was her maiden name, was married to John Beatty and moved to Buck Valley in 1854. Mrs. Beatty was a mem-

ber of the M. E. church for forty years and possessed all the qualities that make a true Christian. Her charming manner and charitable disposition made her a pleasant companion and obliging neighbor and won for her many friends who mourn her departure.
