

# Accident Fatal to New Grenada Man

A New Grenada man, critically injured about two weeks ago in a saw mill accident, passed away at 10:00 o'clock Tuesday morning of last week in the J. C. Blair Memorial Hospital in Huntingdon.

The victim, Charles Bishop, 38, of Robertsdale, RD, died as a result of internal injuries and uremia.

Coroner E. Blair Shore of Huntingdon was called into the case following Bishop's death, and is conducting an investigation of the fatality.

Bishop, a veteran sawyer, was hurt while working for the W. R. Gracey Lumber Company at a mill at New Grenada. The accident happened at 7:30 A. M. on Wednesday, June 11 while Bishop was sawing boards at the mill. It was reported that Bishop had cut one board from a log and started to cut another before the off-bearer removed the first board. The fast-turning saw caught the board and tossed it backward. The heavy board struck the sawyer a terrific blow in the lower right chest and abdomen.

The critically injured man was first treated by a Saultillo physician and then rushed to the Huntingdon Hospital, being admitted there at 9:15 A. M.

Charles Nathan Bishop was born in Hustontown on April 4, 1914, a son of Daniel and Lucy (Ranck) Bishop. He was united in marriage on June 12, 1937, to Lula McQuait in a ceremony performed at McConnellsburg.

The deceased was a loving husband and father. He worked as a coal miner for a few years, but for the past several years he had worked as a sawyer.

He was a member of the Bethel Church of God at New Grenada.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two children, Harold and Donna, both at home. He is also
