

## David Bishop

Mr. David Bishop 76, widely known and highly respected citizen of Licking Creek Township, Fulton County died on January 21, 1958 at a Harisburg Hospital. Death was due to complications of illnesses over a period of years.

The deceased was born a son of the late Nathan T. and Mary Jane Wible Bishop and was born on February 19, 1881 in Licking Creek Township. He was a lifetime resident of upper Licking Creek Township and on December 26, 1900 was united in marriage to Florence Virginia Wagner. The couple resided in the home township where they enjoyed a long prosperous farm life. Mr. Bishop was a member of the Bethel United Brethren Church, but attended for many years the Asbury Methodist Church where he served as Sunday School Superintendent and a teacher. He served as county commissioner for five years.

Surviving are his widow and these children: Pearl A. Bishop at home. Raymond O. Bishop, Knobsville; Edna wife of Floyd Brant of Mercersburg; Bernice, wife of George Hollinshead of Harrisonville; and Romaine, wife of Orlen Bard of McConnellsburg RD.
