

Leonard Bivens

Mr. Leonard Bivens, 82, a highly respected citizen of Connellsburg and a retired farmer died at his late home on E. Lincoln Way on September 11, following a lingering illness. His death is a great loss to friends and relatives.

Born at Big Cove Tannery July 18, 1867, he was a son of the late James and Mary Bivens. He was united in marriage to Emma Reed Dec. 28, 1895 at McConnellsburg. The couple made their home at Webster Mills 43 years and were one of the county's most successful farming couples. During Mr. Bivens' farm career he also served as Fulton County treasurer from 1916 to 1920. He was active in Politics for many years, being a staunch Democrat. In 1944 he retired from farming and moved to Connellsburg.

Surviving is his beloved and devoted wife Emma R. Bivens, and these children: Fred of St. Thomas; Mary E. Bivensinger at home; Harry of New York; and Frank of Newson, Md. Surviving brothers include: George Bivens of McConnellsburg and Jas. Bivens of Webster Mills. Several grandchildren and four great grandchildren also survive.

The deceased was a life long member of the St. Paul Lutheran church of Big Cove Tannery, Pa.
