He is also, survived by two sisters, Carrie, wife of Lewis Clevenger of Mercersburg and Minnie, widow of Daniel Clevenger, McConnellsburg.

During all of his-life, he was a member of the Reformed church, <u>uniting with the Hebron Church in</u> Ayr township as a young man and later with St. Paul's congregation of The Federated Reformed and Presbyterian Church, McConnellsburg.
