

Delbert E. Black

Delbert Eugene Black, 53, of Roxbury, Franklin county, died unexpectedly on Tuesday, April 25, 1967, at 6:30 A. M., at his home. Death was attributed to a heart seizure.

Born at Six Mile Run on October 5, 1913, he was a son of Abner and Sally (O'Neal) Black. He was united in marriage to Mabel E. Black on June 7, 1947.

Surviving are his wife; his mother, of McConnellsburg, and these children: Mrs. Linda Kuhn of Pleasant Hill; Kay Black, Dennis Black and Galen Black, all at home. There is one grandchild surviving. One grandchild preceded him in death.

Also surviving are these brothers and sisters: Willis A. Black of Maryland; Patrick Black, of Waterfall; Merrill Black, of McConnellsburg; Robert Black, of Pittsburgh; Mrs. Ruth Houck, of New Grenada, and Mrs. Hazel Cutchall, of Three Springs.

The deceased was a member of the Three Springs EUB Church at Three Springs, RD. He was a veteran of World War II and belonged to the Madden-Wennick Post, No. 518, American Legion, of Orbisonia. He had served as a Scout leader at Waterfall for five years.

He was an electrician by trade, having served in this capacity with the New Enterprise Stone and Lime Company for six years; operated an electrical appliance store in Waterfall for five years, and for the past 16 years had been employed as an electrician at Letterkenny Army Depot.

Funeral services were held on Thursday, April 27, at 1:30 P. M., from the House Funeral Chapel, the Rev. Charles Tobert officiating. Interment was made in the Bethel Cemetery, Wells township.
