

H. EDWARD BLACK

Harry Edward Black was born July 3, 1870, and died at his home in Dublin Mills, Sunday morning, December 23, 1934, aged 65 years 5 months and 20 days.

The cause of his death was pleurisy, with possible pneumonia and heart trouble of which he has been afflicted for a long time. He was married twice, his first wife was Emma Sourbrine, and to this union were born the following children, Carrie, wife of Floyd Shaw, Hustontown, Pa.; Newton, whose address is unknown; Alice, deceased, wife of Jerre Knepper, Dublin Mills; Gertie, deceased, wife of Allen Lewis, Mt. Savage, Md.; Benjamin, deceased; Minnie, wife of Edward Burns, Petersburg, Pa. In 1901 he married Katie Hess of Dublin Mills, and since that time his home has been at that place. To this union were born the following children: Rhoda, wife of John R. Grissinger, Dublin Mills; Arthur, of Norwood, Phila.; Mildred, wife of Chas. Russels; Jane, wife of Carl Christensen; Paul and Glover, all four of Stanley, N. Y., also a twin of Glover, who died in infancy. He is also survived by the following brothers and sister: Lizzie Rice, Mt. Savage, Md.; Mack, of Barberton, Ohio; Newton, Six Mile Run, Pa.; Sylvester, Six Mile Run, Pa.; Jacob of Broad Top City, Pa.. He had one sister deceased, Rachel, wife of Jack Martin, Mt. Savage, Md.

About 1906 under the influence and preaching of Rev. Harry Daniels, he was converted, baptised and joined the church at his home in Dublin Mills. For many years he was a member of the I. O. O. F. No. 538, Six Mile Run, Pa. He was a skillful miner by trade, at which he worked in early life. When his health began to fail he turned his attention to farming, and sometimes serving as boss of gangs of men in the construction of roads in this community.
