

Isaac Bolinger, a retired blacksmith died at his home in Three Springs, on Saturday, Dec. 1, at 8:15 p. m. after a long illness.

He was a son of Jacob and Margaret (Baker) Bolinger, and was born near Dublin Mills on July 5, 1877.

On Dec. 27, 1899, he was united in marriage to Miss Emma Bedford of Needmore. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Gideon P. Sarvis in the Hustontown parsonage.

During his early life Mr. Bolinger was a farmer and later learned the blacksmith trade. He was employed by the Rockhill Coal Co. at the No. 9 mine for nearly 27 years.

He was a member of the Three Springs Methodist church and took an active part in its activities. For some time he was treasurer of the Sunday school and was also a trustee for many years. He was a member of the Three Springs I. O. O. F. Lodge No. 790; Frances Rebekah lodge

No. 578; and the Royal Arcanum Lodge of Carlisle.
