Mrs. Mary Jane Bratton was born in Concord, Franklin county, Pa., August 21, 1829, and died in Taylor township, Fulton county, Pa., March 7 1889.

At a Methodist camp meeting near her parental home, Mary Jane Campbell at the age of 13 years, gave her heart to God, and her name to the M. E. Church, remaining a faithful member. On the 12th day of March 1850, she married Isaac G. Bratton.

Industry, frugality, kindness, modesty, consistency, and uniform piety were prominent traits of her character. Her free hearted hospitality and multiplied deeds of charity will never be forgotten. On the merits of the atonement alone her hope rested. Faithful in that which was least, and loyal to every thing noble and Christ-like, yet unassuming, humble minded, and tender hearted, with a high sense of honor, strong of will, but obedient to conscience. she left a record which which shall never die. Moreover her industrious life was not complete until by the will of God she was made symmetrical by protracted suffering. Before being released her husband as well as her six surviving children were given a clear testimony that wife and mother was in readiness for a flight to the "Land of pure delight where saints immortal reign."

Funeral services were held in the Church on Clear Ridge on Sabbath morning the 10th inst. The Rev. Mr. Deible, her pastor, preached to a large concourse, with great acceptability from the words, "Her warfare is accomplished."
