Another Ex-Soldier Gone.

On Sunday, May 5, 1889, Abel Brown died at his home in Taylor township this county, after years of suffering and disability incurred while a soldier in the late war. His age was 54 years, 4 months and 5 days. His remains were buried in the M. E. graveyard at Clear Ridge on the 7th inst. Six brothers and five sisters attended the funeral. One brother and one sister had preceded him. His father is still living in Huntingdon county at the age of 94 years.

His death was caused by a growth on the bowels, a consequence of chronic diarrhea, for which he was pensioned a few years ago, at \$8 per month. He was a member of Captain Thomas Sipos' company in the 158th Penna. regiment.

The deceased was one of the kindest hearted of men, a good neighbor and a useful citizen. He leaves a widow and several children who have the sympathy of their many friends and acquaintances in their sad bereavement.
