

# Fisher

Altho not unexpected the sad news of the death of Mary Jane (Gordon) Fisher, Friday, March 30, 1928, cast a gloom of sorrow over the community. She died at the home of her cousin, Moses Gordon of Sharpe, Pa. where she had made her home since last November. Mrs. Fisher had been in bad health for about three years but was able to help herself until three days previous to her death. She was a daughter of John and Maria Gordon and was born and raised on a farm near where she passed away. A few years ago she left the farm and lived at Needmore during the summer and with relatives during the winter. She was aged 78 years, 1 month and 5 days.

Mrs. Fisher joined the Methodist church during her girlhood days and continued a life long member, the central force of her life was loyalty to her church.

She is survived by three sisters; Mrs. Caroline Lewis of Charlestown Va.; Mrs. Sarah Shire of Kewanee, Illinois and Mrs. Nettie Bennett of Camp Hill, Pa. She is also survived by one step son, Charles W. Fisher of Council Bluffs, Iowa.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from her late home in charge of her pastor, Rev. Harry C. Moyer. Her remains were laid to rest in Zion M. E. cemetery, beside her husband, who preceded her to the better land many years ago.
