Clyde Robert Fletcher, 47, of Baltimore, died in that city on Tuesday, July 21, 1970, following a short illness.

Born in East Providence Township, Bedford County, on July 28, 1922, he was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Fletcher of Warfordsburg.

He was a veteran of World War II, having served in France and Germany. He was the recipient of the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star.
