Homer Lee Scriever, 27, son of Mr. and Mrs. Grier L. Scriever of Buck Valley, was instantly killed early Thursday morning, December 4, when the pick-up truck in which he and a companion. Charles F. Shank, also of Buck Valley, were driving crashed into the side of the Conococheague Creek bridge between Hancock and Hagerstown.

This was the second tragedy in the Seriever family in a year. A brother of the dead man, Reed L. Seriever, was killed on January 29, 1952, when his car crashed near Warfordsburg.

The deceased served in World Way II. a member of Company C, 324th Infantry, and was employed by Fairchild.

Besides his parents, he is survived by two sons; two brothers, Robert of Hagerstown and Kenneth, serving in Korea, and two sisters, Mrs. Sheldon Dencen and Miss Pauline, both of Hagertsown.

Funeral services were held on December 8 at the Buck Valley Christian Church with the Rev. Orville Shick officiating. Military services at the adjoining cemetery were conducted by the Webster B. Harrison American Legion Post of Hancock.
