David Samuel Strait of near Waterfall, well known Fulton county farmer, died on Tuesday, November 8, 1949, at 5:20 P. M., in the Chambersburg Hospital. He had been ill for the past six months.

The deceased was born September 1, 1891, near Waterfall, a son of Sheridan and Sarah (Wolfe) Strait, both deceased.
