

## REASON R. YOUNKER

Reason Ralph Younker, died at his home in Thompson township, September 8, 1933, paralysis being the cause of his death. He had been in failing health for some time, but bore his suffering with patience. He was born on September 8, 1869. His death occurring on his 64th birthday.

He was a son of the late Adam and Susan Suffecool Younker.
