Herbert R. Zilch, 62, of Chamhersburg, RD 5, a construction inspector (general) with the Depot Facilities Division at the Letterkenny Army Depot, was found dead early Wednesday afternoon, May 28, 1969, at the depot in the cab of a wrecked pickup truck, the victim of an apparent heart attack.
